Facility policy 3.001, Personnel Staffing, states that regular evaluation of staffing patterns will be conducted. Discussion with the nurse in charge of the medical department stated that the issue of staffing is discussed in both weekly and quarterly meetings. The medical unit currently has a day, evening, and night shift. The staffing on the day shift is one registered nurse, one licensed practical nurse and one medical technician. The evening shift consists of one registered nurse and two licensed practical nurses, and the night shift has one licensed practical nurse. There is a nurse practitioner who works four to five hours per week on Thursday. Both the registered nurse and nurse practitioner are on-call 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
